As 2017 has arrived, we are excited about the path the Lord is directing. Personally, God has seen fit to keep us healthy, for which we are extremely grateful. Our family of four children, with spouses and six grandchildren, is doing well and thriving.

Daily news headlines give us all pause to wonder if anything is going well, but we know God is at work:

In 2016 IM's **India** ministry highlights include the expansion of the Grace Bible College campus, the addition of more GBC students as well as multiple

church planting by GBC graduates. Many tribal groups are being reached with the Gospel. More children are being reached in our India Children's Home.

In **Egypt**, a newly-purchased home will soon facilitate one of our flourishing church plants and our Child Sponsorship Program with 30 precious children is doing very well. We've assisted impoverished women and families with micro business opportunities and their children are doing well in their studies as a result of regular mentoring. Their hearts continue to transform as the Gospel is shared through love in action.

In **Jordan**, women and children are able to use a women's community center in conjunction with a medical clinic in which we are collaborating. In **Iraq**, we've helped thousands with aid and have added another church plant. (cont'd on Page 2)


Walking Through ISIS Rubble

Dr. John and Dee ministered in Iraq in November 2016. This is a continuation from December's issue of John's visit into recently liberated Qaragosh and Karamles.

People were walking behind me as I stood staring at the enormous, burned and desecrated church. I turned to see two Nineveh Protection Unit (NPU) soldiers.

The NPU is made of exiled Christians who have volunteered to serve under the Peshmerga Fighters. Under the guidance of Iraqi police, they have been able to push ISIS, or Daeesh, forces out of Karamles.

The two men were from Qamishli, Syria (I ministered in Qamishli in 2011). When it was announced that any Christian could volunteer for the NPU, they were both tired of running and decided to join the unit. As Christians, they went to Iraq to find protection from ISIS in Syria. They and their families settled in Qaraqosh and felt reasonably secure. However, ISIS entered their city, and again they had to flee to Erbil for safety, along with 60,000 other Christians from the Nineveh Plain.

I saw a cross hanging from one soldier's ammo pouch. I took the men in my arms and prayed. Walking to the command center, I found two generals from the NPU. They shared amazing stories, stating if the Lord had not been with them, they would have been overrun by a superior force. They seized weapons from ISIS, and in just a few hours moved as a unit clearing streets, tunnels, houses and cisterns of hidden ISIS fighters. (con't on Page 2)

We've seen national pastors receive encouragement and training through our Pastors' Conferences, and women receiving Scriptural and personal training in our Women's Conferences in India, Egypt and Iraq.

Our faithful **US and international staff** and ministry partners impact thousands of lives each month for the Kingdom and are an incredible blessing to us. Unfortunately, ISIS fighters rigged many homes with tires fashioned into explosive booby traps, leaving streets filled with the acrid smell of burning rubber. What amazed me was hearing the general speak with genuine humility that not one of his NPU soldiers was killed in the fighting. Some were wounded, but no one was killed. He said Jesus Christ was watching over each of them in the battle, and God strengthened their hand to overcome those who sought to destroy Christians in this city and other cities on the Nineveh Plain.

The goal of Daeesh forces has been to wipe every Christian from Iraq and build their "caliphate" upon the seized wealth of homes and businesses. I could not help but think of the work Indigenous Ministries has done to help these Christians through protection, encouragement, food and daily needs. I thank God for your prayers and gifts to bring them aid relief.

Many of our supporters have asked, "What can we do about ISIS?" There are several things to understand as we look at this crisis. You have helped in a very real way to battle ISIS by caring for the people they sought to destroy. It gave people time to think of what is truly valuable and many have put their trust in Jesus Christ. They were Christian, but now many know the true Christ. Please hear me when I tell you we have overcome evil with good, just like the Lord told us to. Next month we will explore how the church will rise from the rubble in Iraq. - Dr. John Cook

Because of extreme poverty present in the villages where we work, many children have lost at least one parent. We have been ministering the love for Christ to these children and families through our Child Sponsorship Program. It is designed to provide for the needs of the child, as well as lighten the burden for the surviving parent. Our program provides for the daily needs of each child and places a strong emphasis on consistent Bible exposure. Our team reports the children's grades are improving and they love memorizing Bible verses! Through our micro business opportunities available to their mothers, our team also reports an increase in the mothers' openness to receive the message of the Gospel. - Sarah Rieger

Education Alleviates Poverty

This month we continue the story of the Payatas Dumpsite from December's The Liaison issue. The Lord invited Resty and Mel Enguerra to participate with Him in the transformation of lives through Promise Land Christian Church. The church has been ministering in Payatas since 1988 through the leadership of Pastor Erlindo and wife, Esterly Ganiban. Their initial involvement was, and still is, in providing scholarships to scavenger elementary school children at Promise Land Christian School (PLCS).

Through this program, the children not only receive better/excellent academic education, but most importantly, learn and internalize Godly Christian values. The family is exposed to the Good News through the church. Eventually the children and families come to the saving knowledge of Christ and become positive influences in the church and secular community.

Our Philippine partner, PLCS of Payatas, currently has 250 students enrolled in Kindergarten through 6th grade, with eight teachers and five classrooms. Since 2015, 50 of these students are in the Scholarship Program. Tuition, school uniforms, shoes, books and breakfast are paid for. The students stay with their families. The cost/student is \$35 per month or \$420 per school year.
